## Recipe

This editions recipe is inspired by both last months WI meeting and their competition subject of 'Make a Cake' and the wonderful season of Autumn. Why not take a nice stroll around the village and source your own blackberries.

**Blackberry and Apple Cobbler** 

Serves: 6



#### Ingredients

For the fruit:
700g Blackberries
700g Cooking Apples
6 tbsp Sugar
5tbsp Plain Flour
1tbsp Melted Butter

For the topping:
150g Plain Flour
2tsp Baking Powder
60g Butter
3tbsp Sugar
120ml Buttermilk (or fresh milk with 1 tbsp of lemon juice)

Peel, core and roughly chop the apples and mix with the blackberries, sugar melted butter and flour. Place in a 22x33cm ovenproof dish.

For the topping, sift the flour an baking powder together, Rub in butter until mixture looks like fine breadcrumbs. Stir in sugar and buttermilk.

Drop spoonfuls of the topping mixture on to the fruit, it doesn't have to be completely covered.

Bake in the oven at 190c/gas mark 5 for about 30-40 minutes or until the fruit is soft and topping risen and golden.
