Islip Village hall has been awarded a £20,000 grant from Biffa Award to upgrade the central heating system. Biffa Award is a multi million pound fund that helps to build communities and transform lives through awarding grants to community and environmental projects across the UK as part of the Landfill Communities Fund. The funding has paid to improve and upgrade the central heating to the whole building including the kitchen and toilets. The work is now complete and the hall is open again for hire. # If you go down Tollbar Rd today, you're sure of a BIG surprise

## Our new sports pavilion, the story so far:

In 1948 Colonel Stopford Sackville gave over an area of land between Kettering Road and Toll Bar Road to be used as sports facilities in memory and recognition, of those local men who lost their lives in the war. An early pavilion was destroyed by fire and then replaced by two adapted ocean going containers, incorporating changing, toilet and shower facilities.

Three years ago, in November 2012 we realised that those existing changing facilities were fast approaching the end of their usable life, with a leaking roof and collapsing floor, and were rapidly becoming unusable. Many people had put in long hours to keep the facility up to scratch, in particular, Darren Andrews of Thrapston Town Warriors who made an enormous effort to keep the building usable. Time was not on our side, so a decision was made to seek funding from many sources to finance a completely new up to date building for the benefit of existing clubs, both adult and children, and most importantly for the use of all potential clubs in the future.

The clubs currently using the field joined with the parish council and each made a contribution as follows....

Thrapston JFC. £4000, Warriors JFC. 1000, Burton Utd. FC 1000, Sargents FC. 1000, Thrapston CC. 1000, Thrapston JCC. 1000

#### But, this was obviously not enough, so...

Councillor Richard Maxwell drove the project on, and without his inspirational leadership we would not be where we are today. Richard secured promises of funding from the following organisations:

Premier League & The FA Facilities Fund, delivered by The Football Foundation: £150,000 The Premier League & The FA Facilities Fund is funded by the Premier League, The FA, and the Government, via Sport England. It is delivered by the Football Foundation, the country's largest sports charity. The Football Foundation is currently celebrating its 15-year Anniversary. Since it was launched in 2000, the Foundation has awarded around 13,000 grants worth more than £540m towards improving grassroots sport. It has used this investment to attract additional partnership funding of over £740m – delivering over £1.3bn of investment into the grassroots game.

Football Stadia Improvement Fund: £50,000

Funded with £5.2m each year from the Premier League, the FSIF is the country's largest provider of grants towards projects that help improve the comfort and safety of lower league football grounds in both the professional and amateur game. These improvements range from new football stands and turnstiles to floodlighting and improved provision for disabled supporters.

Sport England Inspired Facilities Fund: £50,000

An additional £50,000 came from Sport England's Inspired Facilities Fund. To date the fund has helped more than 1,800 local sports projects across the country to improve and refurbish sports clubs or transform non-sporting venues into modern grassroots sport facilities.

East Northants Council Community Facilities Fund 50,000 WREN's FCC Community Action Fund. £44,500 Islip Parish Council. 10,000

The first major funder to come on board was East Northants Council Community Facilities Fund who with their £50,000 showed true and enthusiastic commitment to improving locally available facilities, it was their help that spurred on the raising of the other funds, and for that we are most grateful.



The whole process is taking place under the watchful eye of parish council chairman Bob Lymn, who has done some of the problem solving and running around to make sure certain elements are dealt with on time.

With the support of the above we instructed architects, obtained planning permission and contracted Colson & Loring to carry out the build.

Funds being tight we approached Sir Robert MacAlpine and were given valuable and enthusiastic support in a very tangible way by Roger Smart and Piers Morgan who provided the following assistance: ground preparation and site clearance plus provision of temporary changing and toilet facilities to enable the cricket teams to continue using the field during the build. In total this generous help saved us around ten thousand pounds. Adrian Eyles brought his tractor and equipment to enable soil tests to be carried out.

We also received enthusiastic support from Wendy Brackenbury our local councillor, plus encouragement from our MPs past and present Andy Sawford and Tom Purseglove. So this is where we now are, foundations are finished, walls are rapidly going up, our new pavilion is quickly becoming a reality.
