 - 2. Mandate signed for new bank account. Cllrs resolved to authorise that Cllr Maxwell could have view only privileges. Clerk to action
- 19/77 **New Model Financial Regulations** these have been issued from NCALC. Clerk had checked over and advised on differences from old ones. Cllrs resolved to adopt them.
- 19/78 **Finance -** Received and approved Bank reconciliation & Payments for October 2019
 - -Clerk had been in discussion with Pensions Employer Services Manager- a number of options available to council were discussed. Council asked for more information before deciding- Clerk to ask Pensions manager if the cessation would incur another valuation-
 - Budget Monitoring document- defer to Nov meeting, so will include figures up to end of October.
- 19/79 **Highways** -Cllr Fryatt & ENCllr Brackenbury met with Steve Barber from Northants Highways- to assess appropriate locations to put VAS. Steve will come back with details and a rough costing to enable the locations to be licensed. Cheapest battery, then solar, then hard wired onto lamp posts.
