Internal Audit by NCALC IAS- this was completed remotely and there were no issues identified. An informal suggestion was made to undertake a review of the effectiveness of Internal Control – this will be scheduled for next March.

- 19/173 **Sports Field-** Cllr Maxwell update. Sports Pavilion all locked down and closed- Taking opportunity to bring forward pitch renovation although having to be done by hand as Plant Hire companies have closed down. Very time consuming and labourious. Finance review-£7000 been carved off budget by removing planned project work. Hopeful most hirers will come back, but could lose some due to cutbacks. Sustainable situation for 3 months- and could finance it for a prolonged period but would have to moth ball it.(ie switch everything off completely, and just pay utilities). However, this would incur higher costs ultimately due to boiler problems/ increased repairs needed/increased works needed for pitch preparation- Third Pump now broken on boiler. Sport England issued a fund but excluded parish councils from applying. Various funding discussed- review next meeting. Cllr Brackenbury will also ask at ENC if there is anything available
- 19/174 **Highways** Cllr Fryatt absent-defer to next meeting
- 19/175 **Recreation Ground** To note that this has been closed on government advice, but that Annual Playground inspection has still been scheduled
- 19/176 Community Matters-
 - Defibrillator- To note that Quote was approved for light in telephone box- waiting for works to commence and that batteries will expire in July. Clerk getting quotes for battery
- 19/177 **To receive District & County Councillors'** Reports Cllr Brackencury
 - 913 business have received 10.3 million of either £10,00 or £25,000 distributed by ENC.
 - Stagecoach will be running a No 16 as a replacement for the withdrawn Diamond Coaches service.
