NOTIFICATION OF ESSENTIAL MAINTENANCE WORKS A14 between junction 11 and 13 near Thrapston

I'm writing to let you know that we'll be carrying out essential maintenance work on the A14, between junctions 11 and 13 near Thrapston. Some of our work will also be on Denford Road/Midland Road, near to the A14 viaduct.

During our scheme of work, we will:

- carry out surveys and joint maintenance on the viaduct.
- upgrade some fencing.
- clear the existing drainage system and replace drains where required.
- carry out improvements to some parts of the drainage system.
- clear vegetation on the verges and in the ditches.
- carry out new planting in some areas of the verge.

When will the work take place?

Our work is planned to start on **26 January 2022** and is expected to be completed by **mid-April 2022**.

We will work in phases as our works progress, to minimise disruption to local residents, businesses and road users.

How will the work affect traffic?

To maintain a safe environment for our workforce and motorists, we need to use a mixture of full road closures, lane closures, and temporary traffic signals. The planned details are:

- **Overnight works on the A14**
31 January 2022 to 18 March 2022, between **8pm** and **6am**. Full carriageway, slip road and lane closures.
- **Daytime works on Denford Road/Midland Road:**
26 January to 15 April 2022, between **9am** and **5pm**. Temporary traffic signals.

For all road closures, we'll put in place fully signed diversion routes, which have been agreed with the Local Authority. All carriageways will be open as usual outside of our working times.

A drawing showing the main diversion route is enclosed for your information. Please contact us if you would like further detail.

Please note that all our planned roadworks may be subject to change due to weather conditions and unforeseen circumstances.

Polite request

To lessen overnight disturbances to the communities closest to our work, we politely ask all heavy vehicles to follow our signed diversion routes.

How will the work affect businesses and residents?

We'll make sure that access to businesses and residences is maintained.

Please note that some of our work may be noisy. We will try to keep this to a minimum.
