WITH ALL YOUR COMPLAINTS AND OUR PUBLICITY, INCLUDING OUR ONGOING APPEALS TO SPEEDING MOTORISTS TO BEHAVE RESPONSIBLY, YOU WILL PROBABLY BE ASTONISHED TO READ THE FOLLOWING:

Recently a traffic survey was conducted by the Safer Roads Team of Northamptonshire Police, it lasted for just seven days and was based on Lowick Rd.

When I read the results I was both astonished and very disappointed.

In only SEVEN DAYS recently just under 7,400 vehicles of one kind or another travelled through the village.

1176 exceeded the 30mph limit, of those 301 drove at speeds for which they could be prosecuted.

What must we do to make drivers realise how dangerous This is?

We will be lobbying the police to get more stringent controls in our little community, meanwhile the limit is 30mph but as the signs advise Twenty Is Plenty, please keep this in mind and help protect the safety of residents both young and old.
